Home-Based Services

- This program provides active treatment-based services to children and adult family members with intellectual/developmental disabilities.
- **Home-Based Responsibilities**
 - Provides support in the comfort and familiarity of a home, educational setting, and/or community environment.
 - Provides services to promote skill development and community integrations.
 - Coordinates with other programs in which family members may participate.
 - Serves more than 1000 families in 16 Illinois counties.



Child and Family Connections (CFC)

- CFC serves as “the front door” to families throughout North and Northwest suburban Cook County for early intervention services (Ages 0-3).
- We are the second largest provider of early intervention services in the State of Illinois.

CHILD Therapy Services

Early intervention/developmental therapies and family supports utilizing an interdisciplinary, family-focused approach.

Take a Break

- In-home and drop-off Respite Programs.
- Provide regularly-scheduled times for parents to receive relief from their daily responsibilities through the innovative use of trained volunteers.
- Weekly in-home and semi-monthly center-based programs in various locations throughout the west and northwest suburbs.

Community Day Services (Adult)

- Clearbrook's Day Services offer an array of weekday services to adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities. By providing a variety of opportunities, our clients are able to expand their interaction with their peers, their community and the world at large within structured settings.
- Participants are encouraged and supported in expressing their interests in the planning of services.
- Day Services provide participants with opportunities to continue to learn based upon their interests and abilities. Emphasis is placed on socialization and community participation.

CHOICE

- Located in Crystal Lake
- Provides participants with the support to discover who they are and what is meaningful in the lives. CHOICE empowers participants and provides individualized opportunities including;
 - Employment
 - Leisure activities, social activities, and accessing community resources
 - Volunteering



Community Day Services

- Rolling Meadows (Riley), Palatine (LEAP) and Gurnee (North)
- Art activities serve all clients and utilizes the visual arts to promote independence, motor control and personal expression.
- Music activities includes music appreciation and music making with drums, guitars, pianos and tambourines.
- Fitness and exercise are stressed for all program participants.
- Each participant has a series of individualized goals, developed around his or her unique needs.

Naturally Gifted

- Located in Crystal Lake
- Naturally Gifted is designed to offer vocational enrichment and hands-on skills training for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Participants follow a twelve-week curriculum that integrates classroom learning, hands-on skill development, and community job shadowing.
- Participants learn computer skills, laundry, janitorial, stocking, bagging, clerical, and customer service



Getz

- Clearbrook's Workshop helps adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities to develop their vocational skills, habits and attitudes leading to community job placement.
- By offering a variety of work opportunities, our clients perform jobs in a workshop setting and are paid as subcontractors based on their individual levels of productivity. Assistance is given to help our participants with speed and quality. Teamwork and social skills are important elements of a work environment - our job coaches teach proper work place etiquette.



Partners in Adult Learning (PAL)

- Located in Palatine
- The PAL Program is an innovative partnership between families, service providers, and the community. PAL provides continued learning opportunities for young adults over 18 years of age with intellectual/developmental disabilities and physical challenges who graduated from high school.



Community Employment Services (CES)

- Offers a wide spectrum of services and support to provide clients with the skills, experiences, and opportunities to productively engage in meaningful work that matches identified interests.
- Support Includes:
 - Independent Employment
 - Supported Employment
 - Job Coaching
 - Vocational Skills Evaluation & Training



Clearbrook Autism Program (CAP)

- CAP provides specialized programming with highly structured schedules for adults with Autism.

STAR Academy

- After care program (3:00–6:00 p.m.)

 - Health & Wellness
 - Social Skills



Senior Day Services (Rolling Meadows)

- Activities and Creative Experiences for Seniors (ACES)
- Located in Rolling Meadows (Krause Building)
- Enhancing the quality of life for its participants by providing active programs and choices designed to meet the unique needs of individuals with intellectual/developmental disabilities in the later stages of life.




Clinical Services

- Behavioral Services
 - BCBA's and Behavioral Analysts
- Psychological/Counseling Services
- Speech Therapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Physical Therapy
- Medical Consultation
- Family Support Specialists
- Clinical Services offices are located in the Riley Building (Main Office) and Krause Building. These services are provided to most Clearbrook programs.

Community Mental Health Center (CMHC)

- Serves residents that have an intellectual/developmental disability and a mental illness.
- They do not have to be a part of Clearbrook.
- Designed to support the community while providing additional support to the current individuals served.
- The CMHC accepts insurance and Medicaid.
- The CMHC accepts referrals by contacting the Licensed Clinical Professional Counsel (LCPC).



Community Mental Health Center (continued)

- Three therapy systems used: individual-based, group-based or family-based.
- Focuses on the individual through solution-focused, cognitive-behavioral, and dialectical-behavioral therapy.
- Sessions are available via phone, video chat or in an offsite location.
- Sessions are scheduled based on client's needs: daily, weekly or monthly.
- Therapeutic needs will be assessed using the IMCANS, Illinois Medicaid Comprehensive Assessment of Needs.
- The CMHC is located in Crystal Lake at the Clearbrook West Administrative Office. Additional offices will be opening soon.
